Key Dates	- November 3rd → General Election Day! Polling place hours vary by municipality throughout Maine. Voters in line when their polling place closes will be allowed to vote. - Vote Early in person from October 4th – October 29th, 2026, at your local town or city office. - Any registered Maine voter may request an absentee ballot. Absentee ballots must be received by the municipal clerk by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. - Maine voters are not required to show photo identification to cast a ballot. Voters registering for the first time or updating their registration may need documentation showing identity and residence.
Our Goal	Transform inactive voters into consistent participants through personal conversations, starting with helping to elect Joe Baldacci to represent Maine's 2nd Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives on November 3rd, 2026.
Why is this election so important?	Maine's Future is on the Ballot this Year - Families across Maine are feeling the pressure of rising costs, from groceries and housing to health care and energy bills. - Decisions made in Washington impact Maine's rural communities, seniors, veterans, working families, and small businesses. - This election is about making sure Mainers have a voice in the decisions that affect their everyday lives. Healthcare Access: Access to affordable care, especially in rural communities, remains critical. Maine Communities: From small towns to larger cities, decisions made today will shape Maine's future for years to come.
